Alan Crosby is a nationally known local and family historian, who has been editor of *The Local Historian* since 2001.He is the main local history contributor to the BBC *Who Do You Think You Are?* magazine. He has published extensively on diverse aspects of the history of Cheshire and Lancashire and has a particular interest in landscape history.

Keith Lawrence a former veterinary surgeon, ecologist and senior animal health manager, is also a historian. Publisher of leaflets and articles on drove roads, milestones, turnpike roads, tollhouses and toll collectors, and a book *Turnpike Roads Round Nantwich*. He specialises in the Cheshire Road System.

Mike Blackburn At 18 he became a draughtsman / surveyor for the Ordnance Survey and began a 40-year profession. Landscape and history are inseparable, and the history of transport is the history of humankind in the landscape. The development of railways, added to waterways and roads, changed not only our own region, but those regions connected to it, and far beyond our shores.

Colin Schroeder is the Archivist for the Vintage Aeroplane Collection at the old RFC Hooton Airfield and for Hooton Park Trust. A published author on historical aviation with radio and TV appearances to his credit too. Cheshire's pioneer aviation began with propellers, and the future of powered flight may surprise you.


